The following publications have recently come to our attention, but ARE NOT AVAILABLE from the Fifth Estate: *The Luddites: Machine Breaking in Regency England*, by Malcolm I. Thomis.

An interesting book, although Thomis seems to miss the whole point about the Luddite uprisings. Instead of realizing the role that British unions took in smashing the direct action of the machine breakers, Thomis tries to argue that things would have been better if the craftsmen had had stronger unions. *The Guillotine at Work, Vol. I: The Leninist Counter-Revolution*, by Gregory Petrovich Maximoff.

Perhaps one of the best books written about the early days of the Russian Revolution and the years of Bolshevik terror that followed.
